# 4. CARE Registry is coming soon:

The chronic angioedema registry (CARE) is a prospective, international, multicenter, observational (non-interventional), open-ended disease registry being developed and managed by GA<sup>2</sup>LEN ACARE and UNEV e.V.

The aim of this project is to establish and to run a global registry for all patients with angioedema, i.e. patients with MMAE, BMAE, and other types. The results of the registry will be published and should help to improve the medical care for patients. We aim to have all ACARE centers partake in the CARE registry.
